### Focus for the Year

As in the past, I will continue to have **two objectives for the teachers**. I will ask them to provide engaging instruction in the classroom and to get to know their students as individuals. I believe students learn better when they are engaged in the learning process and the more teachers know about their students, the more they can individualize their instruction.

The guidance department will be working on an **anti-bullying and harassment campaign** that will work with students on how to treat each other with respect, inform student on who they can talk to if they are being bullied or harassed, and will provide parents and teachers with information on what bullying and harassment can look like. ## 2010 AP Test Results

One of the best indicators of the rigor of a secondary school curriculum is student performance on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination program. This assessment process is the culmination of years of prior academic preparation and is the capstone of a rigorous and demanding advanced placement instruction delivered by a highly trained cadre of exceptional teachers. Mt. Hebron High School has been known for outstanding student performance in this college-level learning opportunity. The 2009-2010 school year was no exception to this legacy and we are justifiably proud of the collective effort of our students and teachers.

Three-hundred fifty-two Mt. Hebron students took 779 Advanced Placement examinations. As a school, we increased the number of students taking AP exams by 49 and increased the number of tests taken by 105. On a scale of 1 to 5, where 5 is the highest score, **87% of the students scored a 3, 4 or 5. Sixty-six percent of the students who sat for the examinations scored either a 4 or 5.** Here are a few examples of how

well Mt. Hebron students preformed on the Advanced Placement Exams.

Mt Hebron student performance was particular strong in both **Calculus BC** where 36 of the 40 students who took the exam scored a 5 and in **Calculus AB** where 62 of the 116 students who took this exam scored a 5 and 39 students scored a 4. Equally impressive was the student performance in **English Language & Composition** exam where 66 students scored either a 4 or 5. Sixty-three of the 68 students who took the **Economics** examination scored either a 4 or 5 and 53 of the 54 students who sat for the **Statistics** examination scored 3 or better. All 18 students who took the **Comparative Government** examination received a 3, 4, or 5 and 28 students scored a 4 or 5 in **World History**. These impressive results are celebrated by all of us here at Mt. Hebron and once again affirm the Mt. Hebron High School is a great place to grow and learn. Congratulations to all the AP students on such excellent scores and to the teachers who prepared them not just this year, but in previous years as well.

## Register NOW for Our Upcoming SAT- PSAT Prep Course

Most juniors and seniors will take the SAT this coming school year. Sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT in October. This course helps students prepare for these important examinations.

**Location:** Mt. Hebron HS

**Parents:** Results have been *excellent!* This is a *real opportunity* that you don't want your student to miss. The course supplements our curriculum and will focus on improving test-taking skills, tips for answering each type of question, a math review, vocabulary development, essay writing and building confidence.

**Fee:** \$225 (includes tuition, materials & \$25 non-refundable registration fee.) The course is open to students from any high school. A portion of the fee benefits the PTSA.

## 2010-11 Attendance Procedures

Below are a few reminders regarding attendance procedures at Mt Hebron. Information regarding attendance can also be found in the student agenda book. If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Dribben at 410/313-2880 or email at [maura\\_dribben@hcpss.org](mailto:maura_dribben@hcpss.org).

### Student absences

When a student returns to school after an absence they must bring a written note signed by a parent/guardian citing the date of the absence and an explanation why the student could not attend school. The student will drop the note to the attendance office between 7:10 and 7:20. A students has **two** days to bring their note to the attendance office or it will be unexcused. If a note is not received the absence will remain documented as Truancy. Please see the student agenda book for more information.

### Late Arrivals

Students must be in their first period class by the 7:25 bell. If a student arrives late to class or late to school they must sign in at the designated area where they receive a pass to class. If a student is unexcused to class a verbal warning will be issued. Students get **two** verbal warnings before a detention notice is issued. The **third** time the student is late unexcused a 6:45 a.m. detention is scheduled. A form will be given to the student indicating the time, date and place of the detention. The fourth time late is also a 6:45 a.m. detention. The fifth time late an administrator will schedule Saturday school after contacting the parent. Consequences thereafter will also be handled by an administrator. A note is required from a parent with a

legitimate reason for being late to school. Please explain the reason for the lateness, the time expected of arrival, a contact phone number and your signature.

### Early Dismissals

If a student must leave school he/she should take a signed note to the Health Room prior to the start of school. Please put the reason for the early dismissal, the time a phone number and your signature on the note. An Early Dismissal pass will be issued to the student. The student will then show the pass to the teacher during the class period the dismissal is requested and will leave class quietly at the designated time. If an appointment is made at the last minute, please contact the Health room and a pass will be delivered to your child. There will be no need for you to come into the building if you follow these procedures. If there is a reason that you cannot come into the building please make sure that you have your ID with you.

**Effective July 2007: Students are counted present for a full day if the student is in attendance for four hours or more of the school day. A student is counted present for ½ day if in attendance for at least two hours of the school day, but less than four hours.**

### Pre-Arranged Absence

The forms for a pre-arranged absence can be found in the front office or the attendance office. These forms are used when a student is aware ahead of time that they will not be attending school. Parents may be granted three (3) excused absences per year when the absence is pre-arranged with the teachers and the principal. (Additional absences will not be excused.) Reasons for such absences include college visit or family commitments that cannot be scheduled on a non-school day. Pre-arranged forms must be signed by the parent/guardian, each teacher and the principal. The forms on the [hcpss.org](http://hcpss.org) website do not have the teacher comment boxes. Please pick up these forms from Mount Hebron. These forms should be turned in two weeks prior to the day(s) your child will miss school if possible.

### Religious Absence

There is a form that must be filled out prior to a religious absence. You can pick this form up in the attendance office or the front office.

## PBIS at Mt. Hebron High School

The **Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support System** (PBIS) process is an approach to improving school climate and creating safer and more effective schools (visit <http://www.pbismaryland.org> for more information). PBIS at Mt. Hebron began with a focus on 9<sup>th</sup> grade students last year and we are excited to announce that both 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will participate in 2010-2011. We anticipate that PBIS will be school-wide beginning with the 2012-2013 school year!

### What Does PBIS Look Like at Mt. Hebron?

First, students participate in lessons emphasizing our four key positively-stated school-wide behavioral expectations. At Mt. Hebron, students go for the **GOLD** by respecting **Grounds**, **Ourselves**, **Learning** and **Diversity**. Next, staff recognize students who demonstrate these behaviors by giving them Golden Tickets. Then, students turn in their tickets for a chance to win monthly prizes and school-wide recognition. Finally, data is collected, analyzed and used to determine next steps and PBIS improvements.

## Howard County Library's New Miller Branch Construction Update

If you have traveled to the Miller Branch lately, you likely noticed construction next to the current building and on Frederick Road from the west. Approximately 350 feet of Frederick Road is being lowered in order to improve sight distance for the new Miller Branch. In addition, Frederick Road along the frontage of the existing Miller Branch will be milled and repaved during the road closure period. Weather permitting, the project is expected to be completed before public schools resume on August 30.

Flagging operations and detour signs direct traffic as needed, and variable message signs advise motorists of the construction and the new traffic pattern. A recorded message at 410.313.3637 carries details and updates.

Construction of the new Miller Branch Library is expected to be completed by Winter 2011-2012.
